

From 16<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> September, a meeting reserved only for coordinators was held in the Italian school to evaluate the first year of the project and plan the activities and mobility for the second year.

On the first day, after the work session, the whole group went to Bevagna, a beautiful town where our guests could see one of the finest medieval squares in Umbria, a mosaic floor dating back to the second century A.D. (it is what remains of the Roman public baths) and visit some churches and the museum.

The next morning we had the second and final working session, then, in the afternoon we went to Scacciadiavoli, a famous winery situated amongst the beautiful Umbrian hills. There we had an interesting guided tour and after tasting their wine and the local products we reached Montefalco. It is one of the most interesting medieval towns, also famous for its dominant position (it is called "the balcony –rail of Umbria") in fact it is perched on a hill top affording stunning views of the surrounding olive groves. We admired the beautiful main square, walked through the ancient narrow alleys and visited the Church of Santa Chiara and the Museum of San Francesco where we could admire the fresco cycle painted by Benozzo Gozzoli between 1450 and 1452 that depicts the Life of Saint Francis and a Nativity by Perugino (early 16th century).

This meeting and these moments made us close-knit and made known to our partners the artistic and food and wine riches of our territory.
